

Purple Up Day

Wednesday 30th of April is the day to 'Purple up' for Month of the Military Child in Wales!

Why purple?

Purple was chosen because it symbolizes all branches of the military, a combination of Army Green, Air Force Blue, Coast Guard Blue, Marine Red and Navy Blue.

How can you get involved?

- Wear purple (consider raising money for an Armed Forces charity).
- Create purple artwork and displays.
- Take photos of what you get up to.
- Share your photo/s on social media (tag @SSCECyrmu on X and Facebook) using the hashtag #MotMCCymru – with a message to Service children, thanking them for their important role in the Armed Forces community.

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UNDERSTAND

the experiences of an Armed Forces family

Watch and share the NEW SSCE Cymru Service children's stories to learn more about their unique experiences.

Watch and share the NEW SSCE Cymru school good practice films to learn how different schools across Wales are supporting their Service children.

Give Service children the opportunity to deliver a presentation about their experiences of being part of an Armed Forces family or share photos, to showcase their positive opportunities.

Use the Royal British Legion's <u>Remembrance Teaching</u> <u>Resources</u> for age appropriate resources to "reflect on Service and sacrifice" and learn more about our nation's history.

Run a story time using books about Service children's experiences, the Armed Forces lifestyle, being a pupil in a new school or appreciating differences in one another. A series of six bilingual <u>Little Troopers</u> books can be requested for FREE from <u>SSCECymru@wlga.gov.uk</u>.

Learn about the different cultures and traditions from the places Service children at your school have lived.

SUPPORTING SERVICE CHILDREN IN EDUCATION WALES CYNORTHWYO PLANT MILWYR YN YSGOLION CYMRU Utilise the <u>Armed Forces Day Learning</u> <u>Resources</u> to explore the history of the Armed Forces.

On a world map, pinpoint where Service children have lived, or their parents have been posted.

Run a discussion group with your Service children to gain a better understanding of their experiences and identify ways the school can respond to their needs.

Organise for the local <u>Armed Forces</u> <u>engagement team</u> to deliver a presentation/class on a topic linked to the Armed Forces.

Make a Time Zone Wall, including a series of clocks to show the different time zones around the world where Service children have lived, or their parents have been posted.

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ENGAGE with the Armed Forces community

Celebrate a pupil's family member who has previously served or is currently serving in the Armed Forces by asking children to share pictures and medals.

Include information in school newsletters/social media about support available from <u>Armed Forces</u> organisations and charities.

Use the Month of the Military Child banner and square image on social media and email signatures.

Support Service children in writing a thank you card to someone who helped them or was a good friend to them when they arrived in the area.

Invite pupils to say a few words of appreciation about the Armed Forces through writing poems, songs or writing letters.

Attend your local Armed Forces Covenant forum meetings to network and make connections with the local Armed Forces community. Ask a current or former member of the Armed Forces (a parent, sibling or friend) to be a guest speaker at the school and share their experiences.

Invite your Local Authority Armed Forces Champion to attend events/activities during the Month of the Military Child.

Work with SSCE Cymru to achieve your <u>Armed Forces Friendly School Cymru</u> status.

Create opportunities for Service children to meet and share experiences with other Service children within the local area.

Invite the <u>engagement team</u> at your local Armed Forces base/unit/station to deliver an activity (STEM or teambuilding) with pupils.

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CELEBRATE

Service children's experiences

Celebrate Purple Up day on Wednesday 30th April.

Create a display to celebrate Month of the Military Child using purple handprints.

Encourage Service children to get creative and produce a piece of artwork that showcases their experiences of being part of an Armed Forces family.

Hold a Month of the Military Child assembly. Invite the Service children to recite the Dandelion poem.

Conduct fundraising activities and donate the proceeds to a local or national Armed Forces charity.

Offer tweens and teens the *Life of a Page Turner Reading Journal*, a personal journal in which military young people can express their thoughts and feelings in words and drawings. Available through <u>Reading Force</u>.

Host a celebratory event for Service children and their family and friends.

Make bunting and posters and use purple balloons to decorate the school.

Create purple and dandelion themed artwork and display around the school.

Complete Armed Forces-themed activity sheets, puzzles and wordsearches, available from <u>Little Troopers</u>.

<u>Sing Dandelions</u> by Never Such Innocence. Music video, backing track and sheet music available.

Support children in entering the Never Such Innocence <u>Poetry and Art</u> <u>Competition</u>. Open 1 April - 2 May.

Support children in entering the <u>Reading Force Memoir Writing</u> <u>Competition</u>. Open 1 May – 31 August.

Tie purple ribbons on a fence or tree for every Service child in the school.

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Little Troopers

Virtual workshops and bilingual books

Little Troopers have created two free online workshops with the aim of bringing Service children together to explore the unique challenges and opportunities that they experience, and to celebrate what it means to be a 'Little Trooper'.

The sessions are pre-recorded as a 'live' event, delivered by an experienced team of facilitators using Little Troopers' primary school resources incorporating storytelling, movement, group discussion and role play. The workshops are open to all Service children in your setting of primary age and suitable for groups of any size.


Crafts

Armed Forces Day 2025

Saturday 28th June

Armed Forces Day is a chance to show your support for the men and women who make up the Armed Forces community: from currently serving troops to Service families, veterans and cadets.

Armed Forces Day in Wales commemorates and celebrates the Armed Forces community and is a partnership event between local authorities, Welsh Government, the tri services and other partners. Each year, Wales' Armed Forces Day is hosted and celebrated in a different region across the Country.

This year Monmouthshire will be hosting the celebrations!

Monmouthshire County Council are inviting Service children and their peers across Wales to get involved by designing a jigsaw piece which will be displayed as one collective piece of art at the Caldicot Castle and Country Park. **Artwork theme:** 'What the Armed Forces means to you'.
